
## **Analysis of Student Satisfaction Survey**

## Academic year- 2022-23


The institution obtained the feedback on the overall institutional performance from the students for the academic year 2022-23. The in charge faculty collected and tabulated the data and finally analysed it to assure if the institution could fulfill the demands or ideas of the students as expressed in the same. Total 35 samples were collected from the third year college students randomly for the sake of transparent and valid evaluation. Out of 35 students, 17 (48.57%) students were male and 18 (51.422 %) were female. It contained various students ranging between 20 to 21 years.

Before handing over the questionnaire to the students, the concerning faculty put its way to fill up. He also helped students in filling up the feedback by translating the questions in the mother tongue of students to receive positive and reliable replies. All questions consists five options based on its validity and reliability on four point scale from 0 to 4. The questionnaire contained 23 questions including 22 close ended questions and one was reserved for open ended question. The questionnaire comprised into five separate section to receive the opinion of students on separate aspects like students' assessment of their teachers' performance during classroom, assessment of their teachers regarding the use of ICT during classroom, students' assessment of their teachers regarding their approach towards students and assessment of the teaching of their teachers.


1) Q. 1 The first question in the questionnaire intended to seek the opinion of students on the way of the communication of teachers with students. 32 students (91.422 %) replied that the teachers are always effective, 3 (8.57 %) told that there is effective communication between teachers and students. It becomes clear from the following diagram:



Q.2 Students were asked to evaluate how effectively teachers use student-centric methods like experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodology to enhance learning experience. 25 students (71.42 %) told that the teachers use above methods to a great extent to enhance the learning experience and only 10 (28.17%) told that the teachers use above methods to at a moderate level to enhance the learning experience. 


Q.3 Students were asked to evaluate the use of body language of their teachers in teaching-learning process. Out of 35 students, 22 (62.85%) told that teachers frequently use body language in teaching-learning process, 13 students (37.14%) opined that the teachers usually use body language make the teaching-learning process impressive. It becomes clear from the following diagram:




Q. 4 This question intended to receive the opinion of students regarding the preparation of their teachers. When the students were asked how far extent teachers engage classes sincerely, regularly and punctually than 26 students (47.28%) told that teachers frequently engage classes sincerely, punctually and sincerely whereas only 9 students (25.71%) replied that the teachers

usually engage classes sincerely, punctually and sincerely. It becomes clear from the following diagram:




Q. 5 In this questions students were asked to rate the use body language of their teachers while teaching. 11 students (31.42 %) said that they every time use body language while teaching whereas 24 (68.57 %) replied that teachers usually use body language while teaching. 


Q. 6 The students were asked how well do the teachers prepare for the classes. 27 (77.14%) students told that they thoroughly prepare before the classes, 8 students (22.85 %) told that they satisfactorily prepare themselves before engaging the classes. It becomes clear from the




Q. 7 Next two questions were asked regarding the use of information and communication technology during classroom. The students were asked to show the performance of their teachers in the use of ICT tools like OHP, LCD projector, during classroom. 9 students (25.71 %) told that the teachers regularly use ICT tools while teaching, 8 (22.85 %) student told that their teachers often use ICT based tools while teaching and 18 (51.42%) students told that the teachers sometimes use ICT based tools while teaching. It becomes clear from the following diagram:




Q. 8 When the students were asked how far appropriate their teachers are able to use the ICT tools during teaching than 19 (54.28 %) students replied that the teachers are extraordinarily are able to use ICT during teaching, 11 (31.42 %) replied that they appropriately use ICT during teaching whereas only 5 students (14.28%) declared the teachers adequately are able to use ICT tools during teaching. 
Q. 9 Students were also asked to assess their teachers on the basis of their approach towards students. When the students were asked how well their teachers are able to communicate with them then 17 (48.57 %) students replied that they are always effective, 17 (48.57 %) told that they are sometimes effective to communicate and only one (2.85%) opined that the teachers are just satisfactorily able to communicate. It becomes clear from the following diagram.



Q. 10 Before engaging a class teachers should familiarize students to the aims and objectives of the syllabus in the class. When the students were asked whether their teachers inform them about the objects of the course/ course outcomes etc. then 27 students (77.14 %) told that they are strongly agree to the statement and only 8 (22.85 %) students are agree to the statement to say that their teachers inform them about the objects of the course/ course outcomes .The picture is clear from the following diagram:




Q. 11 The students were asked to put their remark on whether their teachers identify their strengths and weaknesses and encourage them with providing right level of challenges than 24 students (40.00 %) out of 35 told that their teachers fully identify their strength and weaknesses and encourage them with providing right level of challenges, 21 students (60 %) told that their teachers reasonably identify their strength and weakness and encourage them with providing right level of challenges. 


Q. 12 Students were asked whether their teachers arrange extra-curricular activities like group discussions, seminars etc or not than 22 (62.85 %) students replied that the teachers every time arrange extra-curricular activities like group-discussions, seminars etc. 13 (37.14 %) students


told that that the teachers usually arrange extra-curricular activities like group-discussions, seminars etc. It becomes clear from the following table:




Q. 13 Feedback cum questionnaire of the students contained the questions on the teaching of teachers. The question how much syllabus was covered in the class when was asked to the students, then 29 students (82.85%) replied that around 85% to 100 % syllabus was covered, only 6 students (17.14 %) opined that 70 to 85% syllabus was covered in the class. 
Q. 14 Question was asked to the students to know if their performance in the assignments was discussed fairly by their teachers or not. 23 students (65.71 %) are strongly agreed to the statement by saying that their performance in the assignments was fairly discussed by their teachers, 10 students (28.57 %) are agree to the statement to say that their performance in the assignments was fairly discussed by their teachers and only 2 (5.71%) are neutral to the statement. 
Q. 15 Students were asked to rate the overall impression of their teachers' teaching during the classroom. 22 students (62.85 %) out of 35 told that overall impression of their teachers in the classroom was motivating, encouraging, devoted to the subject and students, friendly and encouraging, 13 students (37.14 %) students replied that the overall impression of their teachers in the classroom was motivating and encouraging. 
Q. 16 Students were asked to rate the environment created by their teachers during the classroom. 29 students (82.85 %) replied that that the environment created by their teachers during the classroom was ideal and only 6 students (17.14%) declared that that the environment created by their teachers during the classroom was ideal. Q. 17 When the students were asked to whether the teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications or not then 17 students (48.57 %) told that they every time illustrate the concepts through examples and applications and 18 (51.42 %) student told that teachers usually illustrate the concepts through examples and applications. 


Q. 18 students were asked to evaluate the facilities available in the institution. When they were asked to put their remark on whether the institution is interested in field visits / tours / surveys / extra-curricular activities etc to make them familiar to the external world or not. Out of 26 students (74.28 %) are strongly agree to the statement that the institution is interested in field visits / tours / surveys / extracurricular activities etc. to make them familiar to the external world whereas 8 (22.85 %) students are agree to the statement that the institution is interested in field visits / tours / surveys / extracurricular activities etc. to make them familiar to the external world and only one (2.85%) are neutral to the statement.




Q. 19 Students were given freedom to assess the teaching and mentoring process in the institution. 21 (60.00%) students replied that teaching and mentoring process in the institution significantly facilitates them in cognitive, social and emotional growth and 14 (40.00%) students told that teaching and mentoring process in the institution very well facilitates them in

cognitive, social and emotional growth. It becomes clear from the following diagram:




Q. 20 When the question was asked to students to rate whether the institution provides them multiple opportunities in sports and cultural activities other than the learning only then 26 (74.28 %) students strongly agree with the statement that the institution provides them multiple opportunities in sports and cultural activities other than the learning only whereas 9students (25.71 %) are just agree with the statement that the institution provides them multiple opportunities in sports and cultural activities other than the learning. 


Q. 21 Students were asked to assess the efforts of the institution to engage them in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvements of the teaching-learning process. 20 students (57.14 %) are strongly agree to the statement that the efforts of the institution engage them in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvements of the teaching-learning

process, and 14 student (40 %) is agree to the statement that the efforts of the institution engage them in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvements of the teaching-learning process and only one (2.85%) are neutral to the statement. Q. 22 When the students were asked to assess the efforts made by the institution to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skill to make them competent in the world of work then 23 students (65.71 %) are of the opinion that their institution takes efforts to a great extent to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skill to make them competent in the world of work and only 12 (34.28%) are of the opinion that their institution takes moderate efforts to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skill to make them competent in the world of work. Q. 23 All previous questions mentioned above were close ended. The last question was in open ended format to offer their suggestion to improve teaching learning experience, sports facilities, and library facility etc. in the institution. Other demands of the students are as to prepare garden, to facilitate smart boards at the classroom, to increase number of reference books in library, to increase number of competitive examination books, renovation of playground, to avail open Jims etc..
